- ACCORD puts RBA into practice by providing quality service to vulnerable communities while empowering them to assert their rights and actively participate in strengthening their resilience.

Ecosystem-based DRR & CCA

- Recognizing the inter-relationship of increasing disasters, changing climate, and environmental degradation, ACCORD adopted this innovative, integrated approach to its work.
- Ecosystem-based disaster risk reduction and climate change adaptation allows a deeper understanding of the changing risks and hazards for vulnerable communities while providing more sustainable and cost-effective methods in reducing their impact.





Disaster Risk Reduction -Climate Change Adaptation - Ecosystem Management and Restoration

- ACCORD uses the ecosystems based DRR- CCA approach wherein the bigger landscape of the project areas is taken into consideration when identifying risks.
- DRR also means climate-proofing and undertaking environmentally sustainable measures.
- ACCORD believes that ecosystems are crucial in Disaster Risk Reduction and Adaptation. They act as buffers to reduce vulnerability and the impact of hazard events by supporting and sustaining livelihoods.
- Due to climate change, ecosystems are threatened even more. We encourage the application of climate change projections in developing early warning systems and adaptation planning, among others.
- DRR is a comprehensive approach that includes the following activities:
- * community risk assessment which integrates scientific information with indigenous knowledge
- * capacity building trainings for LGUs to help them mainstream DRR-CCA-EMR in the local planning processes
- * develop their contingency & disaster risk reduction plans
- * conduct of community drills and simulation exercises
- * implementation of small-scale mitigation projects and livelihood activities

Emergency Response

- ACCORD has always been committed to help communities recover from the effects of disasters. The Centre for Research on the Epidemiology of Disasters (CRED) recorded 207 significant damaging natural disasters in the Philippines affecting 71 million Filipinos from 2000-2012 alone
- Emergency response (ER) activities include provision of food & non-food items, shelter, WASH (water, sanitation, and hygiene), and livelihood support to affected people.
- Activities such as food and/or cash for work and short-term livelihood support are also implemented to facilitate early recovery and ensure that immediate needs are being met.





 ACCORD, together with its international partner CARE Nederland, ensures that DRR is mainstreamed in its ER. This contributes to the creation of more sustainable and resilient communities.
